Supporting activities:

- Collaboration / streamlining of administrative information such as lists of focal points
- Definitions
- Information management
- Improvements of information requests
- --- shortening questionnaires / rephrasing questions (knowing the real information needs)
- --- using existing and base line information; including in the reporting guidelines
- --- references to sources of information provided through reporting to other instruments/organizations
 - --- professional designing and processing of the questionnaires

Major obstacles for streamlining

- Real necessity for each secretariat/ organization to individually collect data to be valid and useful
- Difficulties for the convention secretariats to streamline on short-term if decisions already taken by the governing bodies
- Possibility to streamline only if reporting is regular (some activities are seen as one time requests)
- Poor coordination among national agencies that provide forest-related information

Future Work

- Joint requests and coordinated information management
- All members have agreed to share among their constituencies and network the work/results of Task Force (Portal, Leaflet)
- Side-events (MAR-Viterbo, UNFF-3...)
- Next meeting planned as a small expert consultation (work on joint requests - C&I), possibly jointly with other related meetings
