- To enhance cooperation and coordination

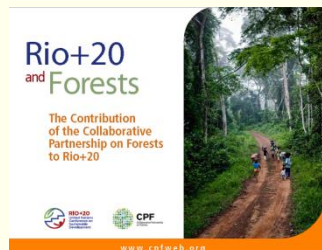
